State Legislature - LTC(R) Tricia Vinson & COL(R) Michael Padgett

Happy 2024! Lots to inform so I will do my best to give a synopsis of what we see as being important to veterans state home in Fayetteville on stable for the upcoming short state legislative session. As a reminder, our state general assembly works in a two -year cycle, with a long and a short session. The short session coincides with elections. As you might assume, most of the heavy legislative lifting is done in the long session; the short session is limited to bills that were approved by either the House or the Senate. Of course, exceptions exist, mostly associated with budget corrections or emergency considerations. As mentioned in the Fall 2023 newsletter, only six bills associated with veterans fit the criteria for consideration during the short session, none would make a significant impact.

One of the Department of Military and Veteran Affairs (DMVA) responsibilities is to run the NC Veteran's State Home program which provide skilled nursing care. There are currently five locations around the state; Salisbury, Kingston, Black Mountain, Fayetteville, and one that just opened in October 2023 in Kernersville. Funding and oversight are managed and approved by the state legislature. Medicare, VA, insurance, and other funding support the program and the medical care is contracted in 5-year increments, currently awarded to Pruitt Health. The NC Dept of Health & Human Services inspects to ensure standards are being met and/or exceeded.

The background above is important because at the end of November 2023, a structural assessment of the Favetteville home was made and determined to require significant infrastructure repairs costing over ~ \$20 million. Sadly, even if those repairs would be made, the ground is unstable and future infrastructure issues would develop, so a decision

was made to close the Fayetteville home by 1 February 2024. A new land will be needed. Originally a 150bed home, maintenance concerns previously had closed a wing limiting the home to 85 beds. At the time of this writing 30 veterans still need to be provided a new skilled nursing care home.

Sadly, some of the DMVA verbal promises to the veterans that are being displaced haven't materialized. Senior leadership initially promised that the DMVA would cover any increased nursing care costs and help with wait list issues due to the short notice displacement. Hopefully, that support will be forthcoming, and we will be able to report a better result in a future newsletter.

Within the State Legislative Short Session, they can deal with emergency budget issues. The emergency closing of a 150-bed veteran state home fits that category. Just as the WNC Chapter had board elections this fall, the NC MOAA Council of Chapters (COC) also had its board elections. Of consequence to this article is that Tricia Vinson has been elected as one of two VPs of Advocacy (state & federal) which connects your chapter to the state level advocacy. She also retains her position representing MOAA on the NC Veterans Council (NCVC) which connects all the Veteran Services Organizations (VSO) so they can speak with one voice as needed. The MOAA NCCOC has already voted to support and prioritize their state advocacy efforts for the short session towards the Fayetteville veteran state home replacement. This normally takes 1/3 state funding and 2/3rds federal funding, although we believe we have found ~\$21 million in federal funds already on hand that could be redirected by state legislative approval towards this

effort. Lots of work ahead for all the VSO state legislative team representatives.

One issue we are aware of that needs to be resolved by the DMVA dates to the 2021-2022 state legislative session. In the appropriations, the legislative oversight directed the DMVA to write a report that would be used to develop a state-wide longterm plan due in spring 2022. They were given \$250,000 and directed to work with the Department of Health & Human Services to assess long term care needs, current homes, services, wait lists, incoming and outgoing costs as well as partnership opportunities. Veteran demographics, satisfaction surveys, etc. were also part of the list of requirements with updates provided annually. From our research, that report was never prepared, with specific NC information, with only generic VA reports provided instead. We have heard they are currently working on that report. That is an issue that will need to be resolved between the state legislature and the DMVA, but we recognize the potential impact to any effort to rebuild the Fayetteville Veterans State home. Hopefully the long-term plan can be developed concurrently with the rebuild of the Fayetteville Veterans Home and maybe the visibility of this effort will provide a positive result.

We want you to be aware of our efforts, of what is happening to the veterans' home in Fayetteville and to gain your support if we need it with our state legislators. We want to support our fellow veterans and ensure they have a strong voice within our state legislature and know we speak as a veteran family across the whole state. This is an election year, and we have brothers and sisters in need and a goal to initiate a

replacement home in Fayetteville.



Congratulations to WNC-MOAA Honorary Member Jeff Miller. Jeff was honored by the Western North Carolina Association of Fundraising Professionals on November 15th, 2023 and was presented with the Summit Award for his efforts founding what is now Blue Ridge Honor Flight.

His entire life, Jeff Miller has liked nothing better than sitting at the side of a World War II veteran listening to stories about the war and life after. It came naturally as the only child of a Navy veteran who served in the Pacific and nephew to an Army Air Corps B-24 bomber pilot who lost his life in 1944 during a bombing run in Czechoslovakia.

"I always had a real passion for the World War II generation," Jeff said. "I guess some people would say I am obsessed with them. I grew up in an extremely patriotic home."

DEVELOPING THE HONOR FLIGHT NETWORK

Jeff and Earl Morse met in person for the first time in Washington on Sept. 23, 2006, the day of HonorAir's first flight. The two then decided to create a "Mother Ship" to combine efforts into one place for disseminating information and for gaining bargaining power. A summit was held in February 2007 and since Earl had begun the first program, it

was agreed to call it the Honor Flight Network. The program branched out across the nation with development of Regional Honor Flight hubs in 42 states to reach veterans in different parts of the country. With the rapid decline of WWII veterans, the program began to also serve Korean War and Vietnam War veterans with WWII vets always going to the front of the list.

In his local area, Jeff serves as president of HonorAir, Inc., and is founder of Blue Ridge Honor Flight, in addition to being co-founder and former president of the Honor Flight Network's national board.

"I have a board here that is just I incredible. My credit is for having really smart and passionate friends. The only way it works is to put a hell of a team together," Jeff said. "It is about a team and their mission."

THE OVERALL PICTURE

To date, the Blue Ridge Honor Flight hub has flown 36 flights to Washington with about 100 veterans per flight, Jeff said. Jeff's push to take Honor Flight national has been a huge success and he has spent many hours traveling the country to help set up programs and even flying with some of the other hub flights, a sacrifice his family has been honored to make.

Humbly, he said the only time he really takes a hard look at the magnitude of the Honor Flight Network and its accomplishments honoring heroes who sacrificed to keep America free is when he is in Washington, D.C.

The work of the Honor Flight Network, which has already served some 230,000 mostly WWII veterans, will continue with the veterans of other wars as they are honored for their service to America.

They will also be transported to the memorials of their respective wars at no cost to them. Efforts made by Jeff Miller and Earl Morse to honor veterans will long be remembered. The two men were recognized by Sen. Bob Dole in 2008 when he nominated them for the Presidential Citizens Medal, one of the highest civilian awards given in the U.S., second only to the Presidential Medal of Freedom. A presentation was made to them that year in the Oval Office by President George W. Bush.






